Station hits airwayes in Visalia

Radio station KVLP is now on the air in Visalia.

Bill Balsley and two dozen fellow community radio enthusiasts installed a 55-foot transmitting antenna on Feb. 26 in the back yard of a home on Houston Avenue.

Balsley spent five years getting the low-power station from Federal Communications Commission approval to broadcast.

"From dreaming about it to hearing it is way cool," he said. The station can be heard at 101.5 FM. Putting out the legal maximum of 100 watts, it has a seven-mile range, Balsley said. Programming consists of a single song - "In-A-Gadda-DaVida," by Iron Butterfly.

"It's a California classic, the song that epitomized FM radio in the 1960s," Balsley said. Playing the same tune over and over to introduce a new station is called "a stunt" in the industry.

Eventually, the noncommercial station will play music such as Dixieland, blues, oldies and Americana.



More importantly, local nonprofit groups will be given an opportunity to tell their stories over the air.

"There are 1,200 nonprofit organizations in our community," Balsley said. "KVLP means 'Visalia Local Power."

Low-power FM got a push in the 1990s from the Clinton administration in response to complaints that corporate radio had stopped serving communities.

Balsley and volunteers spent their own money to buy 'a transmitter costing more than \$10,000. When the nonprofit station runs smoothly, they'll ask the community for financial support to pay the electricity bill.

Ambient, FCC Failing to Address New York BPL Complaints, ARRL Charges

(Mar 17, 2005) -- The ARRL has charged BPL equipment maker Ambient Corporation and the FCC with being unwilling or unable to effectively deal with harmful interference stemming from a New York BPL pilot project. The League this week asked the Commission for the third time to shut down Ambient's Briarcliff Manor "non-compliant system without further delay" until Ambient addresses interference complaints. The League's latest salvo in the Briarcliff Manor BPL battle was in response to a February 10 letter from Bruce Franca, deputy chief of the FCC Office of Engineering and Technology (OET). Franca's letter concluded that FCC measurements in response to Amateur Radio complaints of harmful interference showed no changes were required to the BPL system.

ARRL Seeks Texas BPL Pilot Project Shutdown, Fines

(Mar 17, 2005) -- The ARRL has requested that the FCC immediately shut down an Irving, Texas, BPL pilot project and fine its operator for causing extensive harmful interference to Amateur Radio communications. The League's March 15 filing to the FCC's Enforcement Bureau, the FCC Office of Engineering and Technology and the system's operator comes in the wake of--and supports--a complaint from ARRL member Jory McIntosh, KJ5RM, of Hastlet, Texas. McIntosh regularly commutes through the BPL test zone, which is in the Dallas-Fort Worth area. The FCC has yet to respond to a formal complaint he filed last fall.
